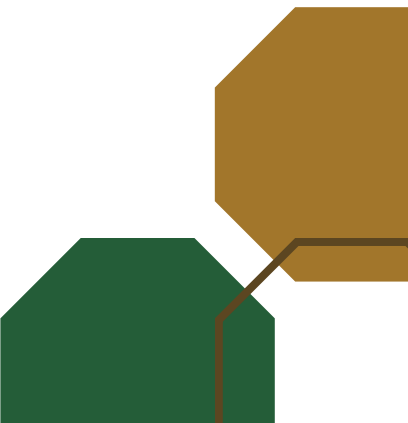

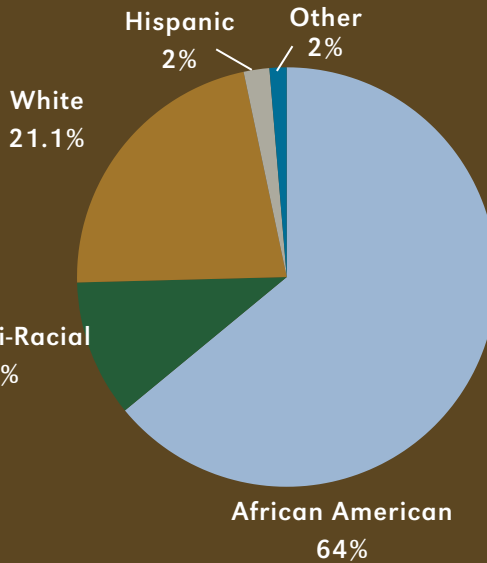

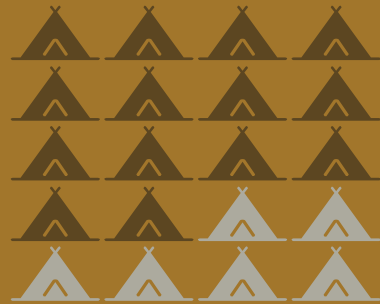

OUTCOMES & RESULTS

Sherwood Forest uses the Positive Youth Development (PYD) framework to help youth build the social-emotional skills, confidence, and resilience needed to thrive academically, socially, and personally. Through immersive outdoor experiences and trusted relationships with caring adults, campers develop self-awareness, emotional regulation, leadership, teamwork, and positive peer relationships in a physically and emotionally safe environment.

Campers participate in traditional outdoor activities including hiking, swimming, canoeing, fishing, and backpacking alongside literacy, STEM, creative and performing arts, and environmental education activities designed to strengthen academic engagement while reducing summer learning loss. These intentionally-designed experiences foster confidence, problem-solving, belonging, and lifelong skills. Sherwood Forest's Quest program provides a continuous pathway for youth from first through ninth grade, allowing participants to strengthen key competencies including self-management, mastery orientation, positive identity, academic self-efficacy, contribution to society, and social skills. Outcomes are measured using validated assessment tools to ensure continuous program improvement and demonstrate meaningful growth.

The organization's impact extends beyond the summer through monthly school-year programming that reinforces relationships with youth and families through ongoing mentorship, enrichment, and support. By engaging youth over multiple years, Sherwood Forest creates trusted, long-term relationships that provide stability for children experiencing poverty and adversity. Many campers describe Sherwood Forest as a second home.

INTRODUCTION TO CAMP

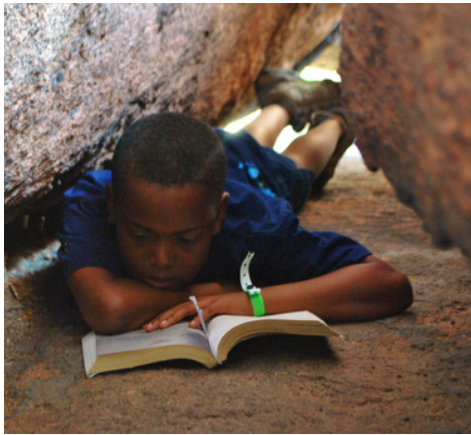
1ST & 2ND Grade

During their 7 day stay at camp, Shire campers learn the ropes of camp life as they develop independent living skills.



DEVELOPING A LOVE OF READING

3rd Grade



3rd graders develop a love of learning by participating in our award-winning Third Grade Book Club. Campers read a book while also participating in hands-on activities (like fire building, fishing and more!) to engage them with the story.

HANDS-ON SCIENCE

4th & 5th Grade

For both 4th and 5th grade campers, summer is centered around exploring Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) with a special focus on nature and the outdoors. Campers develop a thirst for knowledge and a greater understanding of the world around them.



DISCOVERING THE LEADER INSIDE

6th & 7th Grades



6th grade marks the start of Leadership Training, a 4-year program that helps campers become self-sufficient, well-rounded, life-long learners. In 6th grade, campers undergo a process of self-exploration to help them learn and grow as individuals. This work continues in 7th grade when campers use their individual talents to achieve a large goal as a team — either planning and producing an all-camp play or completing a 100+ mile backpacking and canoeing trip.

LEADERSHIP IN THE COMMUNITY

8th & 9th Grade

After 2 years of developing independence and teamwork skills, campers put them into action as they plan extensive trips. As 8th graders, campers focus on impacting their local community as they travel across Missouri to visit colleges and participate in service projects. 9th graders expand their focus to impacting the national community as they plan and execute trips to states surrounding Missouri, visiting college campuses, historical sites, and participating in community service along the way.



SUPPORTS FOR SUCCESS

10th, 11th, & 12th Grade and Beyond

Throughout this three-year program sequence, Sherwood Forest equips youth with the life skills, resources, and support needed to become self-sufficient, solve problems, and resolve conflicts effectively. The program emphasizes the development of healthy social and emotional competencies that prepare participants to become well-rounded adults and engaged members of their communities. Youth receive guidance in planning and successfully completing post-secondary education, trades school, or enlisting in the military while building the academic, personal, and professional skills needed to thrive.

Nine years ago, Natalie arrived at Sherwood Forest for Mini Camp shortly after finishing first grade. Since then, she has returned every summer, growing up alongside the friends, mentors, and traditions that have made Sherwood Forest feel like a second home. Like so many campers, she found a place where she belonged, built confidence, discovered new strengths, and created memories that will last a lifetime.

Last year, as part of her 8th grade graduation requirements, Natalie was asked to complete a service project by volunteering with a nonprofit and organizing a fundraiser. For Natalie, choosing where to serve wasn't difficult. Sherwood Forest was the place she wanted to give back to.

She spent a day volunteering at our annual Trash Bash, helping prepare camp for another summer of adventure. Then, over the course of several months, she poured her creativity and dedication into raising support for camp. Natalie handcrafted sugar scrubs and bath salts, baked brownies to sell at a local craft fair, and organized a donation drive featuring many of the items most needed by campers and staff.

By the end of her project, Natalie had raised more than \$400, using every dollar to purchase supplies from Sherwood Forest's Wishlist. Those items are now helping create a welcoming, well-equipped environment for hundreds of campers and staff throughout the summer.

When asked why she chose Sherwood Forest, Natalie's answer captured the heart of her project: "Sherwood Forest is a big part of my life, and I love it there a lot."

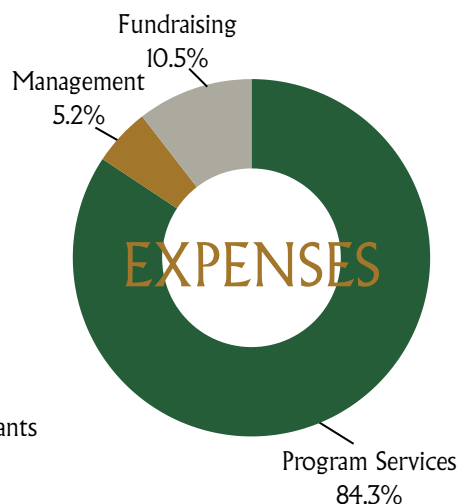
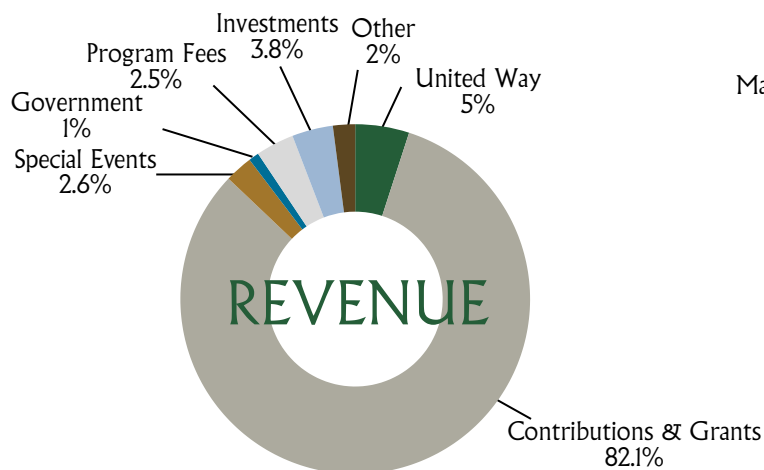
